Senate Bill 863, championed by Senator De León, was passed on Aug. 31, 2012 and was signed into law by Governor Brown on Sept. 18, 2012. The bill makes wide-ranging changes to reform California's workers' compensation system, including increased benefits to injured workers and cost-saving efficiencies. The bill took effect on Jan. 1, 2013, although not all of its provisions will be effective immediately. This was the product of months of negotiations between representatives of labor unions and business owners who historically came together to work on a comprehensive reform package.
