Championing Childhood Cancer Families

Senator Rubio introduced SB 126 to designate September as Childhood Cancer Awareness Month and partnered with the Neev Kolte Foundation and Kids 4 Cancer for California's first Pediatric Cancer Advocacy & Awareness Day. By bringing families, advocates, and policymakers together at the Capitol, Senator Rubio is working to elevate the voices of children and families impacted by childhood cancer and ensure their experiences help shape California's response.

RUBIO HIGHLIGHTS TRIBAL GAMING'S ROLE IN CALIFORNIA COMMUNITIES



As Chair of the Senate Governmental Organization Committee, Senator Rubio reviewed Tribal Gaming Compacts this month, reaffirming the right of tribal governments to shape their own economic futures. These partnerships support jobs, scholarships, essential services, and economic opportunity while respecting tribal sovereignty and strengthening communities across California.

THE RECLAIM ACT: PROTECTING SURVIVORS IN THE COURTROOM

This month, Senator Rubio's SB 1192, the RECLAIM Act, passed the Legislature and is headed to the Governor's desk. Survivors who escape abuse should not be forced to relive it through repeated, abusive lawsuits designed to maintain control long after a relationship has ended. The RECLAIM Act gives courts stronger tools to stop litigation abuse and helps ensure California's justice system protects survivors instead of becoming another weapon against them.



IMMIGRATION

Senator Rubio Stands Up for Families Facing Immigration Detention



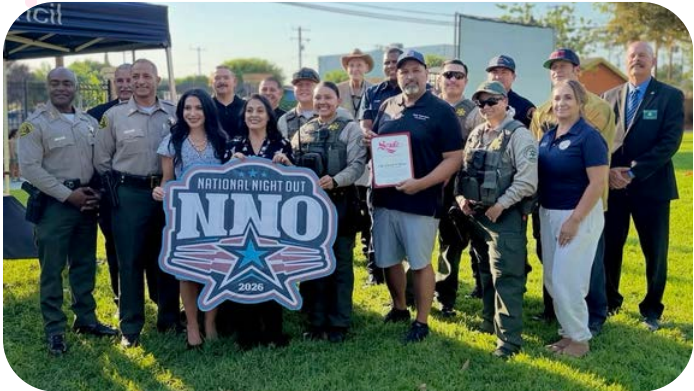
Senator Rubio joined the California Latino Legislative Caucus to stand with immigrant families and highlight SB 1323, her legislation requiring health care providers to notify a patient's family or emergency contact when the patient is in ICE custody. Families should not be left searching for answers when a loved one is receiving medical care. SB 1323 strengthens communication, transparency, and dignity during an already difficult and uncertain time.

Senator Rubio, a survivor of domestic violence and former public school teacher of 20 years, has spent her career advocating for the safety and well-being of children and families. She proudly coauthored AB 1267, authored by Assemblymember Gail Pellerin, to establish 18 as California’s minimum age for marriage. The measure closes a dangerous loophole in state law and strengthens protections for young people from exploitation, coercion, and abuse.
